1	<p>In RFP section-I clause 10 "Evaluation Criteria and Evaluation Proposals" it is more stressed on 'Relevant Power Sector'.</p> <p>In this regard we request you to clarify whether "Power Sector" includes Generation, Transmission & Distribution, Energy Audit, Energy Conservation and CDM Projects.</p>	<p>Experience in "Power Sector" would be considered as per the Scope of Work mentioned in areas of Renewable Energy</p>
2.	<p>Kindly Explain , what do you mean by</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Number of Assignments in Power Sector within Last three years 2) Number of Assignments of DPR Preparation, Studies including FRs and project Management activities) in relevant power sector as appeared in item 10 of section II pertaining to Evaluation Criteria and Evaluation proposals.(1.2 & 1.3) 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Number of Assignments in power Sector within last three years is - "total number of projects executed in renewable energy in last 3 years" 2) Number of Assignments of "DPR preparation....." - this requires the details i.e. the number of assignments specifically in DPR preparation, studies conducted including FRs and project management activities in renewable energy in last 3 years.
3	<p>As per Part-B of Section-IV i.e. technical proposal formats, in para v (profiles of key personnels), there is one column captioned certificates. We seek a clarity on this as to what is exactly required by CDC under this head.</p>	<p>"Certificates" required are of the key personnels, any certificates received by them in specific field, or from professional bodies etc.</p>
4	<p>Reference to Section V: Agreement for empanelment, Clause 3(b), b) ".....It is also advised that the Consultants should also refrain from responding to requests (TOR / EOI / RFP), related with MOP Projects, where such Conflict of interests exists."</p>	<p>At this stage, it is only an empanelment and no specific project has been awarded to the consultant. This is to confirm that:</p> <p>a)This clause will apply only for a specific project which will be awarded to the consultant and,</p> <p>b) Even after then, the consultant will not be allowed to bid for only that project of Ministry of Power which is in conflict with the awarded project, and the consultant would be free to bid for other project of MOP which is not in conflict.</p>
5	<p>Under Form I : Covering Letter, Point No. 3, it has been mentioned that we are required to enclose duly notarized written Power of Attorney along with other attachments.</p> <p>In this connection, we wish to inform you that the Covering Letter (Form I) and the Technical Proposal Formats (Form II) shall be signed and submitted under the signature of the Founder Director of our Company. Thus, would there be the requirement of notarized written Power of Attorney?</p>	<p>Incase Founder Director, is the authorized signatory of your company , there is no requirement of a notarized written Power of Attorney, however the covering letter (Form I) should be sent on a Company letter head.</p>

6	<p>1) Is there a separate financial bid at a later stage or should our bid be limited to the Technical Proposal in Form II</p> <p>2) Do we give our approach and methodology, time frame and work plan for a general DPF preparation or does it have to be given for each technology separately?</p> <p>3) Will MoP make available the Census Data, Map Data and Remote Sensing data for the locations/villages to be studied for electrification through renewable sources or do the consultants have to procure/obtain this on their own?</p> <p>4) The draft agreement states that consultants should submit a statement of nonconflict as a part of the technical bids. Is the attached format, based on the two paras given in the draft agreement, acceptable?</p> <p>5) We presume that format for DPR will be as per the March 2009 document available in MoP website</p> <p>6) Will the answers to our queries be posted on the website on Friday the 26th? Even then the time available is too short to prepare and courier the documents to Delhi and we would appreciate if the submission date is extended.</p>	<p>1) Yes, for now the bid should be limited to the Technical Proposal in Form II, the financial bid would be asked at a later stage.</p> <p>2) Yes, you have to give the approach, methodology, time frame and work plan for a general DPR preparation at this stage</p> <p>3) At this juncture, we are making a Panel of Consultants for preparation of DPR for village electrifications through decentralized distribution Generation (DDG) under RRGVY. The details regarding Census Data, Map data and Remote sensing data will be known at the time of calling the financial proposals.</p> <p>4) The draft agreement is given just for general guidelines/clauses, the formal agreement would be asked for at the time of calling the financial proposals, at this stage the agreement is not to be submitted.</p> <p>5) The March 2009 document of MOP can be used as a guideline for DPR, however, the exact format/guideline would be provided to you at a later stage</p> <p>6) We will post this on website on 26th June, 09, however, we regret that the last date for submission of RFP document (i.e. 30.6.2009) may not be extended.</p>
7	<p>Do we need to provide the documents relating to eligibility criteria again?</p> <p>We have already submitted the required documents with our EOI. Please clarify</p>	<p>No there is not need for providing the details again, you may mention in RFP document, the reference of related documents which you have provided in the EOI.</p>
